Jumped out the Window.



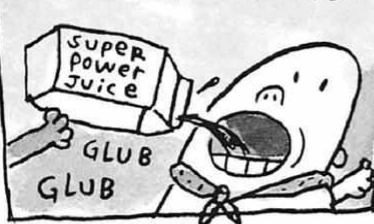
George and Harold

... He Turns BACK INTO MR. KRUPP.

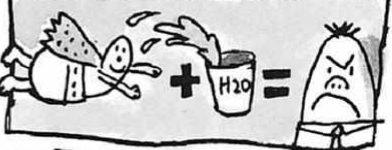

This is George Beard and Harold Hutchins.

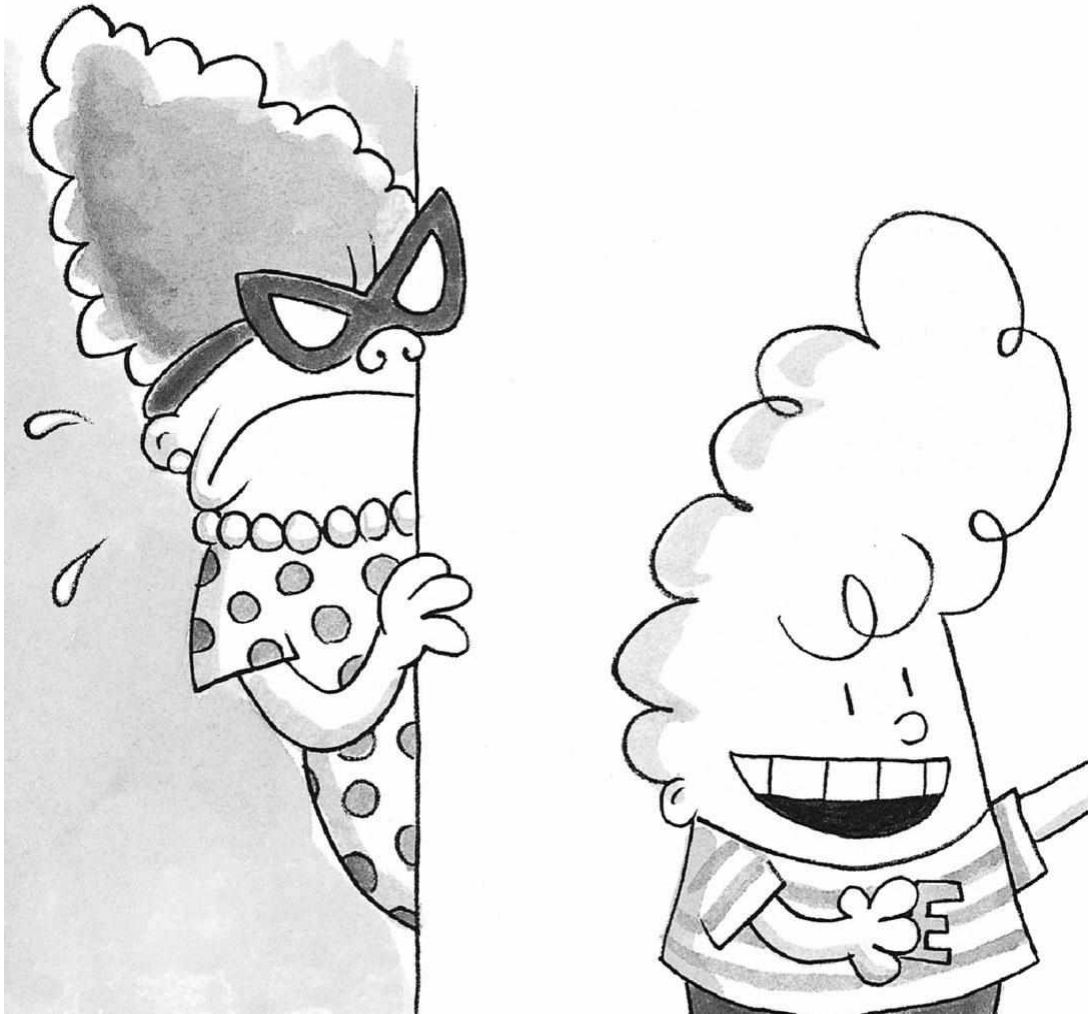
George is the kid on the left with the tie and the flat-top. Harold is the one on the right with the T-shirt and the bad haircut.

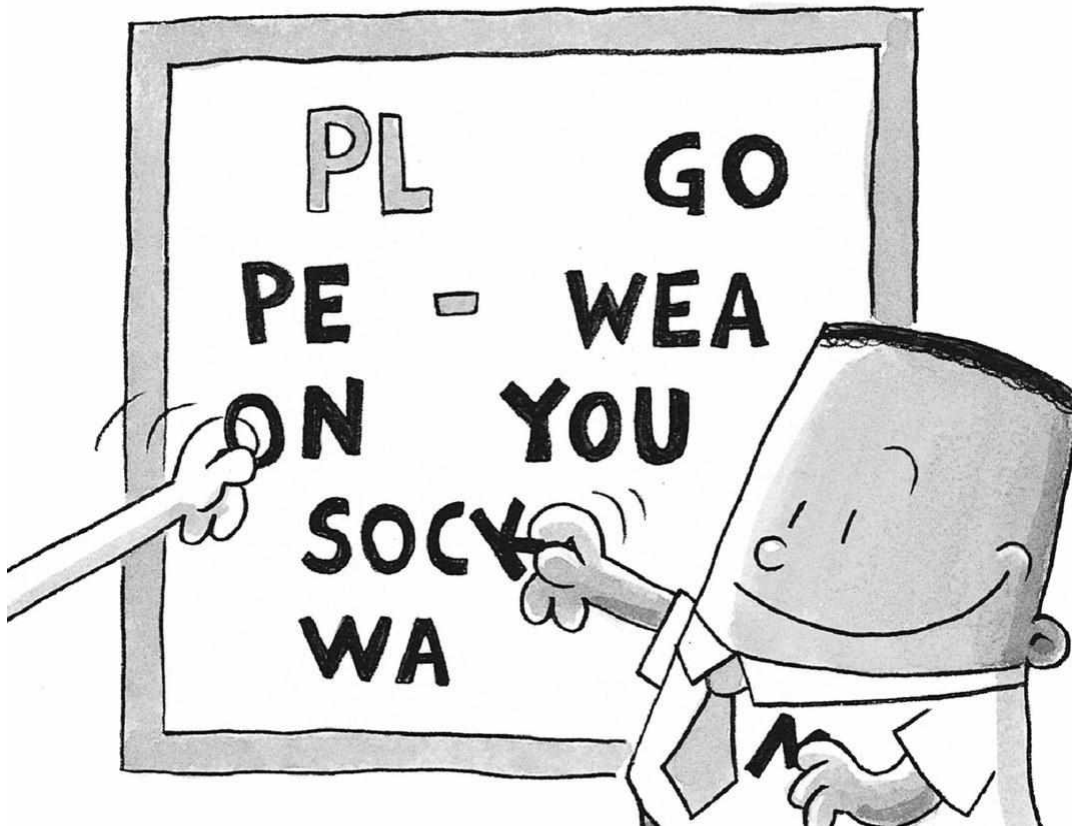
While this was unfortunate for all of her students, it was especially bad for

"*Not today!*" snapped Ms. Ribble. "At the end of the school year!"

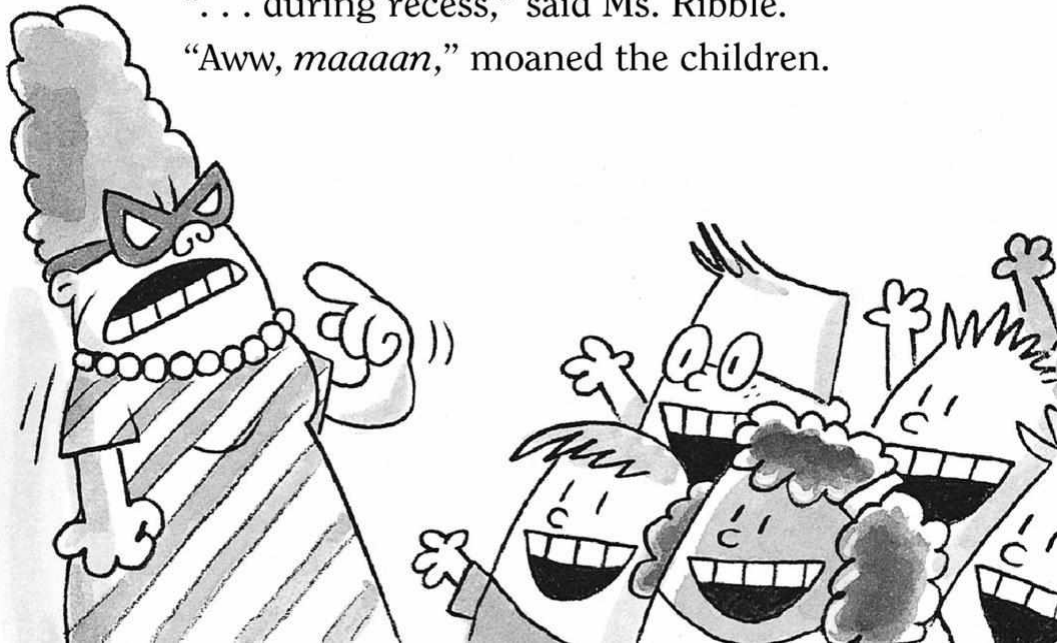
"Aww, *maaaan*," moaned the children.
